Computer contracts for Czech industry

TWO Czechoslovakian contracts worth a total of £170,000 have just been signed by Redifon Computers Ltd.

The first export R850 system has been ordered by Bastro, the engineering factory which is part of the Ostrava coal mines group. Terminals will be installed throughout the works and the application is a real time on-line stock and production control system. Output data will be run on an IBM 370/145 at Okd.

The configuration also includes 16 keystations, line printer, 2 terminal printers and 33MB disk. There are now no less than 15 Redifon systems in the Ostrava area which is a coal and steel complex of half a million people in the North Mor- VZKG, one of the largest comavian area of central Czechoslovakia.

of disk on each system and the R830 systems have 5MB of disk on each system. All systems have extensive data communications facilities.


Applications

The systems will be installed throughout the factory complexes at Ostrava and will provide data input and local processing facilities with data communications links to the Redifon system currently installed in the computer centre. Applications payroll, production include

control, sales ledger, purchase ledger, stock control and banking statistics. One system will be installed in the finance department.

Each day an average of 2.5 million characters will be transmitted to the central system for further processing. The combination of central and distributed data processing with extensive use of remote terminals will provide VZKG with fast information turn-round to control daily operations of steel making as well as providing statistics for future planning.
